

Sickly and shy as a child, Josiah Gregg traveled the plains as a young man. In 1848, he joined a botanical expedition to western Mexico and California,

The frontispiece from Commerce of the Prairies conveys the sense of jubilation as a wagon train approaches Santa Fe, its destination.


